YEAR 2





KS2 Book Recommendations

Fern has an unusual childhood living in the rainforest with her botanist parents. They spend their days exploring nature and gathering information about plants and their properties. However, Fern is no good at Latin, hates textbooks and just doesn't seem to have what it takes to be a plant hunter. To gain a formal education, Fern is sent away from lily pads and humming birds to the city of London. Here she stays with her Uncle where she is bored, restless and pining to be back at one with nature. The only thing keeping her entertained is her unusual plant 'Special', which she found (or stole) on her plane to the LIK.

Despite keeping it a secret, Fern believes she has the gift of communicating with plants and she begins to develop a special bond with Special, until she finds she is struggling to keep it alive. Despite their initial disagreements, Fern and her quirky neighbour, Woody, strive to find a way to care for Special. However, within the city, strange and dangerous plants are growing, causing chaos to the buildings around them. Where are they coming from and how will they stay safe?





Lilv is in Year 6 and her new teacher sets a project about 'One World', where the children work together to research an issue and present it to the class - a task that feels challenging for Lily when she has a stammer. This thought-provoking and beautiful story reels the reader in to Lilv's journey from being the victim of cyberbullying to standing up for herself and 'becoming more hedgehog.' From friendship changes, cyberbullying and new family additions, this unique story leads to lots of discussion for KS2 classes. The story is inter-woven with animal facts and at the beginning of each chapter is a fact about hedgehoas, as well as an illustration. This book is captivating from the first page and is a must-read for celebrating differences. overcoming adversity, and having hope and courage.
