Music lessons at Indian Queens School

We are very fortunate to be able to offer Keyboard, Piano and vocal lessons with Mrs Man and Acoustic guitar with Mr Needle, to our pupils.

Shortly, we may also be able to offer violin lessons, should we have enough interest.

As we work with our local music education hub (Asone), we would like to make you aware subsidies are available for music lessons, if your child meets the criteria below:

- Currently eligible for Free School Meals (not including Universal FSM entitlement for Infants School pupils)
- Currently in Care

If the child meets the following criteria and is receiving lessons from a Hub Registered Provider, they will be entitled 50% subsidy up to £3.00 per lesson:

- Parent/carer in the child's household or child learning is in receipt of Disability Living Allowance (Personal Independence Payment)
- One or more parents/carers in the household are currently serving in the British Armed Forces (as of 1st April 2020)

Subsidies apply to only one instrument per child and for a maximum of 34 weeks over the year.

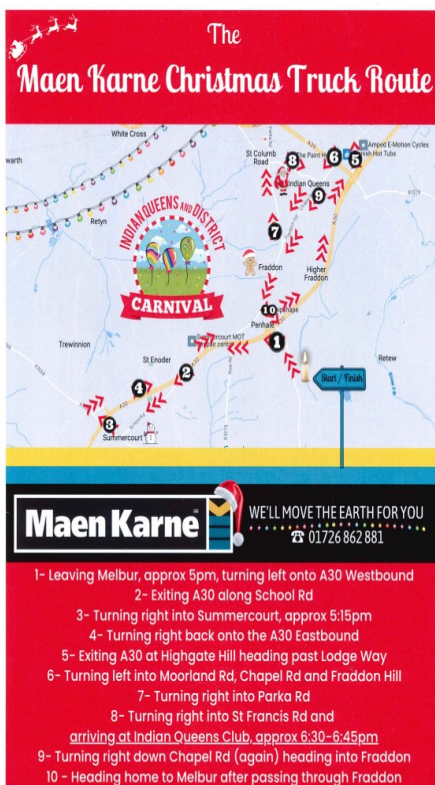
