Religious Education

Narrative (fiction): Roman myths and legends – Romulus and Remus story **Newspaper reports (non-fiction):** Reporting on the invention of the latrine **Poetry:** Roman soldier poetry – kennings

Texts: Romulus and Remus, Vesuvius Poovius, Roman Diary- The Journal of Iliona **SPAG:** Adverbs, prepositions and conjunctions to express time, fronted adverbials, inverted commas and speech, pronouns and tenses.

The Roman Invasion: We will find out the impact of

the Roman invasion and eventual conquest of Celtic Britain. Where did the Romans come from and how far did their Empire spread? Who was Boudicca and how did she fight the Roman invaders? We will find out about important figures such as the emperor Hadrian – why did he have a wall built and where is it? What did the Romans believe in and what difference did they make to Britain?

Science

Sound: How is sound made and how does it travel? How do we hear sounds of different pitch and volume? Find patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it Investigations: by observing, measuring and recording

Mathematics

YR3

Place Value: representing numbers to 1,000, partitioning and flexible partitioning to 1,000, number lines to 1,000, estimating, comparing and ordering numbers to 1,000, find 1, 10,100 more or less, counting in 50s.

Addition and Subtraction: adding and subtracting within 100, spotting patterns and making connections.

Place Value: represeing numbers to 10,000, partitioning numbers to 10,000, number lines to 10,000, compare and order numbers to 10,000, find 1,100,1,000,10,000 more or less, Roman numerals, rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1,000.

Addition and Subtraction: Adding and subtracting two 4-digit numbers with exchange.
