#### BROOKE'S EVENING AT THE CORNISH LITHIUM PRESENTATION

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Since the school visit from Cornish Lithium, Brooke has been very interested in the lithium mining which is beginning in our village of St Dennis. The nice man there called John Vine (who is the man Brooke had her picture taken with which is enclosed) wrote back to Brooke and said that there were not any tours possible yet but that there will be in the future. John said that there was a public meeting and presentation at the football club in the village at 6:30pm on the 21/03/23 (this Tuesday) and that Brooke was more than welcome to come along and learn about the Was induce than versorrie to come along and learn about the company and how it processes lithium. Brooke went along and took a box containing her bags of crushed granite and lithium, and her safety goggles. John greeted her and introduced her to Tom, the company's geologist. Tom the geologist had a similar collection of granite and lithium in the cample hear. The lited that Brooke hed granite and lithium in his sample bags. Tom liked that Brooke had used her safety goggles and confirmed that Brooke had actually mined real lithium in her back garden!!! Brooke then sat in the front row and listened to the presentation. John spoke of the importance of involving the local community in projects like the ones in St Dennis and said that on a visit to Indian Queen's School, a young lady had become interested in the lithium mining process and mentioned that Brooke was at the presentation and sitting in the front row. Brooke and her dad asked jokingly if there was a job for Brooke with Cornish Lithium and they said after what she has already managed to do with her rocks that they may have a job for her very soon . #### Can you help Cornwall Transport?


Cornwall Transport are looking for people who are willing to do a short interview to camera about how a transport project in Cornwall has benefited them.
