Mathematics

We will be learning to:

- Sort objects by colour, size or shape
- Say some number names in order
- Talk about and compare speed using words 'fast' and 'slow'
- Identify some 2D shapes
- Learn some number names by singing songs

Understanding the World

We will learn:

- To identify different modes of transport
- Talk about the transport that we use
- How different vehicles move
- Talk about transport on the ground, and transport in the air
- It is important to stay safe around roads and vehicles.
- Identify different vehicle sounds.

Expressive Arts and Design

We will learn:

- To sing nursery rhymes including: The Wheels On The Bus, Row Row Row Your Boat and 5 Little Men In A Flying Saucer.
- To us paint to make track marks on paper
 - To cut and stick paper
- To build and construct using blocks
